Prof. Willem Bemelman

Professor of Minimally Invasive and Colorectal Surgery
Amsterdam Medical Centre, Netherlands

Prof Bemelman is an academic colorectal surgeon with 25 years experience fully active in research and major surgery. He set up a world-class colorectal unit in department of surgery at the Academic Medical Center in Amsterdam with an international reputation in the management of complex colorectal cancer, inflammatory bowel disease and complications of surgery. He has over 550 publications, over 20 book chapter contributions and grant money exceeding 3 million euros. He is past president of the ESCP.

Despite an extensive research portfolio and recent governance positions in international societies, he is still very active in patient care performing between 200 - 250 major surgeries annually. He specializes in the “hostile abdomen”, and minimal invasive techniques including extensive experience with transanal surgery.

Professor, Department of Surgery, UCLA School of Medicine, USA

Prof Fleshner completed a fellowship in colorectal surgery at the Lahey Clinic and a fellowship in surgical endoscopy at the Massachusetts General Hospital, both in Massachusetts. Since 1991, Prof Fleshner has been in the private practice of colorectal surgery and is an Attending Staff Member at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles. He is Clinical Professor in the Department of Surgery at the UCLA School of Medicine and in 2010 appointed to the UCLA School of Medicine’s Widjaja Chair of Colorectal Surgery.

His main clinical and research interests are surgical management of Crohn’s disease and ulcerative colitis where he is very widely published and recognised.
